AP Calculus BC should be taken by students who have already passed AP Calculus AB. This course is an extension of AP Calculus AB including additional topics such as parametric, polar, vector functions, and series. Students will take a comprehensive AP Calculus Exam in May that covers content from both AB and BC.

Keys to Success

1. Complete assignments daily.
2. Take clear and concise notes.
3. Study daily. Read the section before beginning the homework.
4. Ask questions to clarify difficulties. Get help the SAME day.
5. Maintain consistent attendance.

Classroom Expectations

1. Abide by all school rules as per student handbook. (Cell phone use, dress code, beverages, computers, etc...)
2. Be punctual and attend class consistently.
3. Respect others space, property and person.
4. Use positive communication skills. Be polite, courteous and respectful.
5. Come to class with an attitude receptive to learning.

Passes

General Procedures

Upon entering the room you should sharpen your pencils, staple your papers, place your assignment(s) on your desk, take out paper for notes and sit in your assigned seat. You are to note the day's assignment(s) and begin working on the Warm-Up.

Attendance

Please read carefully the section in your student handbook on attendance. Remember:

1. It is your responsibility to get all work missed due to an absence.
2. *If you are absent the test day only, you will take it during class the day of your return.*
3. *If you are absent the day of a review, you will take the test as scheduled.*
4. Recovery time will be required for absences in excess of seven (7) classes. (This includes excused absences.)

Office Hours

Supplies

You will need the following supplies: a folder for notes and graded papers, a supply of white, loose-leaf notebook paper, pencils and erasers and a TI-84 graphing calculator.

Grading Procedures The six week grade will be comprised using points:

1. Classwork/Homework: 5 points each (typically). This section may include board work, worksheets and/or written assignments.
2. Warm-Ups/Closure Activities: 5 points each week (typically), collected each Friday.
3. Tests 100 points (typically), quiz and project 30-40 points (typically). Topics assessed in these categories may cover classwork, homework and/or cumulative material. Students are responsible for knowing all assessment/due dates.

Late Work Policy

Homework: accepted exactly one day late for *at most* half credit and no credit any day thereafter

Projects: 10 percentage points deducted *per day* late from the grade the project would have received

Assignments

All assignments are considered due the next class period unless otherwise stated. Students will be given the opportunity to ask questions pertaining to homework in class most days. All graded work is to be done in **PENCIL**. Each assignment should begin on a clean sheet of paper.
