

German I Syllabus

Willkommen zu Deutsch I an Marvin Ridge High School! This course will be an introduction to the German language and culture. We will focus specifically on the four skills of learning the language: speaking, reading, writing, and listening comprehension. I am confident that if you pay attention and work hard, you will succeed in German!

A. Expectations

1. For the Course

- Sei pünktlich – Be **on time** and ready to learn.
- Sei vorbereitet – Be **prepared** for class by having all work completed.
- Sei respektvoll – Be **respectful** of fellow students, teacher, and school property.
- Sei offen – Be **open** to learning about language and culture by challenging yourself!

2. Class Policies

- Be seated and prepared to start class right when the bell rings with all appropriate materials out and ready.
- Wait until transition between activities before getting out of seat (sharpen pencil, throw trash away, etc.)
- Ask for permission to use restroom, sign out, take hall pass, and sign in upon return.
- Only use technology as directed for class-related assignments. Per school policy, cell phones visible any time during the class period will be picked up and taken to the office for the day.
- Wait for the teacher to dismiss class before packing up.

3. Consequences for Not Adhering to Expectations

1. Verbal warning
2. Student/teacher meeting after class
3. Detention and parent contact
4. Administrative referral

How Final Grades are Calculated

- 1st Six weeks = 25%
- 2nd Six weeks = 25%
- 3rd Six weeks = 25%
- Final Exam = 25%

Grading Scale

- A** = 90-100%
B = 80-89%
C = 70-79%
D = 60-69% (59 and below does not pass)

2. Six Week Grading Periods:

Your grade is calculated based on a total points system, which takes the cumulative total points that you have earned for all assignments and divides them by the total number of points possible. You can check Power School at any time to see your percentage grade. In general, tests are worth 80-100 points, depending on quantity of material involved; daily vocabulary quizzes are worth 5 points and periodic grammar quizzes are 20-25 points. Assignments are categorized into speaking, reading comprehension, writing, listening comprehension, and culture, and vocabulary.

C. General Information:

1. Academic Conduct.

Students are expected to follow the Marvin Ridge High School honor code. Cheating or plagiarism will result in a zero on the assignment, parent contact and in most cases a referral to school administration. This includes copying another student's assignment or letting your assignment be copied. Online translators cannot be used to complete assignments, and will result in partial to no credit given. If you need to use an online dictionary to look up a word (or words), mention the source that you consulted on the assignment. These tools should not be used beyond the word level.

2. Textbook

The topics, vocabulary and grammar we will learn this semester will come from the textbook *Mosaik 1* (Vista Higher Learning). You do not need a physical textbook as everything will be posted on Canvas; however, if you feel like having a take home copy would help you, please see me.

3. Tests

There will usually be a test at the end of each unit. They are typically divided into four sections: Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking. If you receive a grade of 69 or below on a test, please plan on attending the next scheduled tutoring session.

4. Quizzes

There will be frequent unannounced five-question vocabulary quizzes. While they won't necessarily be every day, students should make reviewing vocabulary part of their daily study habits. The lowest five-question vocabulary quiz grade for each six-week grading period will be dropped (minimum 4 quizzes). In addition, there will also be periodic announced grammar quizzes. These are usually done through Canvas, and can be may be retaken multiple times if the student is not satisfied with his/her grade. Quiz retakes may only happen after school during tutoring hours, and only one time per session.

5. Homework/In-Class Assignments

Each homework assignment is worth 2 points. If for some reason (besides excused absence) it is not completed on the due date, it may be handed in ONE day late for 1 point. After that, it is a zero. Please note that it is YOUR responsibility to show the late work for partial credit. Expect to have homework assignments every day.

6. Class Participation

Active participation in class is critical to learning a new language, therefore students are expected to be engaged in class activities and always attempt to use German to the best of their ability. Examples of good class participation include: actively engaging in partner conversations and group work; not sleeping during class; not doing work for other classes; asking questions when needed; putting forth

your best effort to make the most of every learning opportunity. Repeated demonstrations of poor class participation will be addressed first through detention and then parental contact.

7. Supplies

In order to remain organized and be successful in this class, please have the following materials with you every day:

- Your charged Chromebook
- Binder with loose-leaf paper and dividers
- Pencils or Pens

8. Absences and Late Work

It is your responsibility to arrange for make-up work. After an absence, check the class website and/or me to find out about the vocabulary, notes and assignments you missed. You have two days per day of absence to complete make-up assignments. Ask for work in advance of an absence whenever possible.

9. Extra Credit

In addition to dropping the lowest vocabulary quiz and allowing retakes of grammar quizzes, each student will receive two passes per 6-week grading period. These passes can be used for one of the following: **1)** a homework pass **2)** a late pass **3)** two points extra credit added into your total points for that grading period. Be aware that extra credit opportunities will **not** be offered for individual students at the end of the semester, so take advantage of the ones that are available to you!

10. Tutoring

I am here to help you in any way that I can, as long as you are willing to ask. Tutoring is offered during SMART LUNCH (days to be announced in class) and after school by appointment.
