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General Description:

Intro to transportation is a basic entry level course where students learn shop safety, tools and equipment. Students will also learn automotive history and the importance of transportation to the economy.

Auto Tech I students will be introduced to current repair techniques for the modern automobile. Students will learn various systems such as brakes, steering and suspension, and light engine repair.

Auto Tech 2 students will be more advanced learning manual and automatic transmissions service and repair as well as more advanced electrical repairs.

Small engine students will learn how to properly diagnose and repair many versions of small engines.

Goals and Objectives:

All students will learn how to properly perform each of the task on their respective task list. Students should be able to pass the ASE MLR test after completing these courses.

1. Repair Tires
2. Properly Change oil and filter
3. Repair minor brake issues
4. Diagnose engine concerns
5. Know all the major components of engines and transmissions
6. Know all the safety concerns in the shop.
7. Know how to properly use tools and equipment.
8. Understand automotive history
